Fall semester is upon us and it's time to schedule an appointment with our graduate writing consultants. **Sign up [here\[gc.cuny-csm.symplicity.com\]](http://gc.cuny-csm.symplicity.com)** to get advice and feedback on written materials and to discuss writing-related issues. GC students can bring writing from a variety of genres, including course assignments, conference and dissertation materials, article manuscripts CVs, cover letters, and more. Consultants address questions on both the micro (e.g. sentence structure, grammar, clarity) and macro (e.g. brainstorming, organization) levels. Consultants do not copy-edit student writing; rather, they help students learn and implement writing strategies. All meetings are confidential and last 45 minutes. Our office is located in **room 3300.10**.

Program Description: The NASA Climate Change Research Initiative – CCRI is a year long internship opportunity for graduate students to work directly with NASA scientists and lead research teams in a NASA research project associated with a science related to climate change. This opportunity will not conflict with the graduate students coursework and class schedule during the fall and spring and is considered to be a part time position that supports the graduate students major area of study and degree program.

During the fall and spring term of CCRI the research team will consist of NASA Principal Investigators who will lead graduate level interns and high school STEM educators to become immersed in a NASA science research area of study related to climate change. Fall and Spring sessions will have a time commitment of 10 hours per week for a period of 10 weeks.

During the summer session the primary research team will add an undergraduate intern and high school intern to the CCRI research team where the graduate student works full time for 40 hours per week for a period of eight weeks to complete the research project, create a scientific research paper, power point presentation and a scientific poster that will be presented at the NASA Goddard Institute for Space Studies and other regional conferences and symposiums. The final symposium may have participants from other government agencies, such as the National Science Foundation (NSF), National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), the United States Department of Education (USDE), the United States Department of Defense (DoD), and many others.
