Education Pioneers (educationpioneers.org) is a NPO which matches interns to its partner organizations throughout the US. They specialize in working with organizations that are involved in reforming K-12 education - for instance in NYC their partners include the Department of Education, the NY Charter School network and "ecosystems" such as Blue Engine (which prepares low income students for college).

They place about 80-120 fellows for their summer internship program (about 40 from NYC) and another 50 fellows in their 10 month "impact" fellowship from September-June. Summer interns earn \$7,200 for 10 weeks while the impact fellows earn \$47,500 plus health care.

Their partner organizations are looking for interns who have one or more of the following skills: quantitative methods, computer science, project appraisal, project management, SWOT analysis. They must have at least 2 years of work experience; on average their interns have 4-7 years of work experience. It is quite competitive - they have about a 11 percent yield rate. Fellows receive leadership development training from Education Pioneers in addition to the salary.
