Research fellows receive grants of \$500 to help defray research expenses

APPLYING FOR THE FELLOWSHIP

All applications & attachments must be received by February 14, 2020

Decisions will be announced by April 15, 2020

While proposals are welcome on a wide variety of research topics (and in a wide variety of disciplines), proposals will be evaluated based on their relevance to key questions in the field of African and African Diaspora Studies and on the basis of their unique contribution to scholarship.

Required application materials:

- 2-page summary of the larger research project (single- or double-spaced)
- 1-page description of the specific research to be carried out with the grant (single- or double-spaced), along with a line-item budget (for up to \$500.00) and research timeline
- Curriculum Vitae (no page limit)
- One recommendation from an advising professor (either directly from the professor or through a dossier service like Interfolio)
